ABOUT HO'ŌLOKAHI

Hoʻolōkahi, Hawaiʻi's all state choral festival for high school students, is sponsored by the Hawaiʻi chapter of the American Choral Director's Association (ACDA). The event's mission is to:

have students work with a nationally renowned choral clinician; provide a high-quality and engaging mass choir experience; and bring together students from schools across the islands.

During the past week, our clinician has visited some of the participating choral programs to meet students and faculty, and to work with individual choirs. As a mass choir, the students rehearsed last night and all day today to prepare this porgram.

ABOUT ACDA

Founded in 1959, the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) is a nonprofit music-education organization whose central purpose is to promote excellence in choral music through performance, composition, publication, research, and teaching. In addition, ACDA strives through arts advocacy to elevate choral music's position in American society.

AMERICAN CHORAL

Membership consists of choral directors who represent more than one million singers across the United States. Members teach choral music in public and private schools—kindergarten through senior high school—and at the college and university levels. They conduct a variety of choral groups, including boychoirs, children's choirs, men's and women's choruses, junior and senior high school choirs, college and university choruses, ethnic choirs, vocal-jazz ensembles, and symphony choruses. They also conduct choirs in their communities and in their places of worship.

The Association is divided into seven geographic regions/divisions, as well as fifty state chapters, each with its own conferences, newsletters, festivals, clinics, and workshops. Whether at the National, Division, or State level, ACDA is structured so that its members can easily involve themselves in the organization's activities.

In Hawai'i, the state chapter of ACDA serves as an invaluable resource for the choral community though the sponsorship of workshops, clinics, and membership meetings throughout the year. A major thrust of our efforts is to bring nationally recognized experts in choral music to the islands to work with our directors, choirs, and individual singers to create experiences that nurture a love of choral singing and deepens the ties among us in the choral community in the state.

ABOUT THE CLINICIAN



Cristian Grases joined the USC Thornton faculty in the Fall 2010 semester as assistant professor of choral music and conductor of the USC Thornton Concert Choir. Born in Venezuela, he earned degrees from the Simón Bolívar University (MM) in Caracas, Venezuela, and the University of Miami (DMA). He has previously served as interim director of choral activities at Central Washington University and assistant professor in choral music at California State University, Los Angeles.

An award winning conductor and composer, Dr. Grases received the prestigious award for the arts in Venezuela, *Orden José Felix Ribas* for artistic merit, first prize at the Emerging Composer Competition at Yale University for his work *Visiones del Llano*—2.

Amanecer, and an invitation from Helmuth Rilling to study at the Sommerakademie in Stuttgart, Germany. Additionally, he has been commissioned to write for several prestigious organizations such as the Piedmont Children's Chorus and the Santa Fe Desert Chorale, and his works have been performed by numerous ensembles including the Los Angeles Master Chorale.

Dr. Grases has participated in numerous festivals, workshops, and events as a guest conductor, clinician, adjudicator, and conducting pedagogue in North and South America, Europe, and Asia. Most recently, he guest conducted in USA, Canada, France, Denmark, The Netherlands, Israel, Indonesia, China, Venezuela, and Japan. He has also presented sessions in the World Symposia in Denmark and Argentina, and will presenting again at the World Symposium for Choral Music in Seoul, Korea this coming Summer. Additionally he has presented at several ACDA regional and national conventions, including at the ACDA Western Division Convention in Santa Barbara this past February.

ABOUT THE ACCOMPANIST

Jennifer Duerden is a special instructor of piano at BYU-Hawai'i. She earned her master's degree in accompanying at Florida State University and her bachelor's degree in piano Performance at Brigham Young University. Having started piano at a very young age, Jennifer has a lifetime of experience on the instrument with her artistic passion in the area of chamber music and accompanying. She has taught at Mississippi Valley State University, Holmes Community College in central Mississippi, and at Leon High School in Florida. In addition to her life as a pianist, she is also active as a performer on the steel pan and as a composer and arranger for steel bands.
